Greetings from sunny Arizona, today is 75 degrees F (24 deg C) Longterm forecast for Wednesday April 5 is Sunny and high of 83 degrees F (28 deg C) (But things do change, be prepared for any weather) Remember to bring your sunscreen and hats and drink lots of water. Don't touch the cactus. They bite back.

It is 8 days and counting till the Arizona Cup. Statistics as of today:

Remember - Check-in, Equipment inspection and Practice Day is on Wednesday, April 5 starting at 1:00 pm. Competition starts on April 6

Due to the high number of Men Recurve, there will be a cut to 64 Men Recurve archers for the 1/32 round for Friday afternoon.

Byes will be granted in the other categories.

All 1/32 OR rounds will occur on Friday afternoon as originally published.

Dress Code is in affect. Reminder: white, navy or khaki pants or an official archery team uniform from a Registered College or the NAA or other NGB, no tie-dye, no denim, no camouflage, men = shirts with sleeves, women = sleeveless if 3" or wider straps. No bare midriffs. Must wear footware (this means shoes or sandals suitable for walking in gravel (and maybe some stickers). Advertising limit to meet NAA and FITA rules. Raingear is allowed in other colors when inclement weather is announced or obvious.
