Why: Learn the essentials to be a confident judge. Sanctioned FITA and USA Archery tournaments and qualifying events require judges. Becoming a judge allows you to help yourself, family, club and FITA target archery and host essential events in your community. There are judging opportunities nationally, in North and South America (COPARCO) and globally. A judge who works up the ranks, (Candidate, Regional, National, Continental (COPARCO), FITA Candidate and FITA Judge) has an opportunity to judge world championships and the Olympics. Lastly, judges are sometimes paid for their service. Currently Arizona State Archery Association tournament judges receive \$25 per indoor 600 round and \$50 per outdoor FITA day.
