• Lines, Lanes, 3-4-5

• Targets mats, numbers, wind flags, staked down.

Target Faces: Printing tolerance license (adequate number)

Seating: Provided, Shade

Judges: Chairs, ShadeScorecards: Round types, Ties

Age Groups: Birth year, FITA Categories

Schedule: Realistic, Sequence
Staff: Volunteers – Results

• Tools: (Magnifying glass, Whistle, Countdown stopwatch, Red pen," Red card", Yellow

card)

Ranking Round:

- Target Assignment
- Recurve: 4 Distance FITA or 70M round (Cadet/Masters 60M)
- Compound: 50M

Individual Elimination Round:

- Flow chart
- Match play (10 sec then 40 per /arrow)
- Recurve, 70M round (Cadet/Masters 60M) Indoor 18 and 25 meters
 - O Sets, 3 arrow ends, up to 5 sets maximum
 - Win 2 set points, Tie 1 set point, Lose zero set point
 - o First to 6 set points wins.
- Compound: 50M 5 ends of three arrows per end. Cumulative score, 150 maximum.
- Alternating (20 sec per arrow) high Q round chooses initial shooting order.
- One arrow shoot tie breaker, score then closest

Mixed and Traditional Team Rounds:

- Match Play (10 sec then 2 minutes for three archers to shoot 2 arrows each)
- Mixed 16 arrow ends 4- three archer 2 arrow per end.
- Traditional 24 arrow ends 4- three archer 2 arrow per end.
- Alternating shooting with timers
- 1 meter line, one person, arrows
- Yellow card
- Ties
- Judge Practice
