semifinals, Wunderle defeated Flute 111 to 105 and Lipponen defeated Rytter 113 to 107. Vying for the gold medal, Wunderle faced Lipponen. Wunderle scored 113 to take the gold while Lipponen won the silver with 110. In the bronze medal round, Flute won the bronze with 110 to Rytter's 108.

In the women's recurve division, Kane was defeated by Jessica Carlson (USA) in a 3-arrow shootoff. These ties are broken by score on the first arrow, score on the second arrow and, if still tied, by distance from the center on the third arrow. Both women shot 6 on their first arrows, followed by both women shooting 8's. Carlson eliminated Kane on the third arrow with a distance on 7.4 cm from the center to Kane's 28 cm! Carlson was shooting very strong against Kane's great performance. In the semifinals Parker defeated Mitsuyama (JPN) 104 to 93. Carlson defeated last year's champion Janet Dykman (USA) 104 to 100. Nathalie Hibon (FRA) eliminated Fernandez (ESP) 107 to 95 and Williamson (GBR and ASU) defeated Jennifer O'Donnell (USA) 110 to 106. The gold medal match pitted Denise Parker against Alison Williamson. Parker shot 106 to Williamson's 104 to take the gold. The bronze medal match had Hibon shooting 102 for 3rd and Carlson placing 4th with 97.

The team round was interesting as always. The US "A" men's team shot a hot 250 against FAT Boys (FIN) 238 to win the men's national team title. Third place was Great Britain with 237 against Japan's 228. The ladies's national team champions were US "A" with 222 against Great Britain's 215. Compound teams, only two, were ruled by ACU Riser, 241, to 2 Gents and A Lady with a score of 235. Ladies club teams found US "B" winning gold with 221, Team Ladies in second with 169. "S" Corporation took 3rd with 217 to Colorado PRA's 211. In the men's club team division US "B" won gold with 237 to Canada Club's 226. A shootoff was necessary for the bronze medal with US Danes winning bronze 29 to California #1's 23.

As last year this tournament ended with a great banquet catered by Humberto Keeme, owner of Rosita's Fine Mexican Food. A big thanks to Humberto and his staff for the great food. This year was a little somber for some of us who were thinking to the near future departure of our friend, Sheri Rhodes. She is currently coaching the Spanish archery team. We will miss her while she is gone but she has done a good job of recruiting workers and "grunts" to continue in her footsteps. Kevin Erlandson will be taking on a lot of Sheri's responsibilities for the next tournament. Our best wishes to Sheri as she gives Spain the benefit of her excellent coaching! We miss you!!!
